New Dog Intake Unit Up & Running

Safe Haven began a project to expand capacity for dog intake earlier this year from three kennels to five kennels and renovate the entire intake area. The isolation area is used to house dogs as they arrive at the shelter until they can be medically cleared, which typically happens seven to 10 days after intake.

Renovation details

To provide adequate drainage, Safe Haven first removed the old concrete floor and drains. The 10 tons of concrete were broken into smaller pieces, and volunteers removed the debris in wheelbarrows.

Five Star Plumbing provided plans, material and labor to accommodate needs in the isolation area. This included establishing proper drainage, rerouting water pipes, relocating and adding sinks and installing a



dedicated water heater. Schuller Concrete poured a new floor which provides adequate slope to allow for effective drainage.

To make the isolation area as sanitary as possible, TSR Coatings applied a polyurea coating to all exposed concrete. This coating reduces odors, provides for easier cleaning, lessens disease issues and prevents waste products from being absorbed into the concrete. At the same time, existing kennels in the general population area were treated with polyurea coating. (Intake continued on page 8)

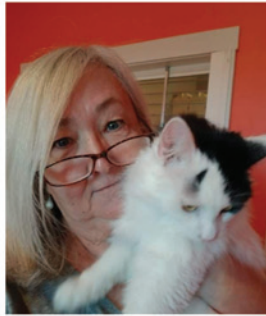

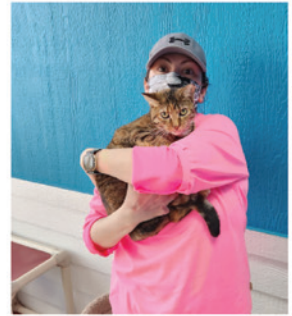

Our Mission Helps People, Too!

As the end of another year approaches, I would like to review Safe Haven's contributions to pets, and just as importantly, the residents of Jo Daviess County.

Safe Haven's mission states "Safe Haven's mission is to provide a temporary haven and treatment for adoptable cats and dogs, place them in suitable homes, increase awareness of the humane treatment of animals and promote spay/neuter programs to reduce the overpopulation of cats and dogs in Jo Daviess County."

Safe Haven ensures that all animals adopted are fully vaccinated and spayed/neutered, and any detectable health issues are corrected. This provides adopters with a carefully vetted cat or dog to begin their years of mutual companionship and affection.

While this is a large part of what we do, it falls far short of being all-encompassing. The rescue and ultimate placement of dogs and cats in nurturing homes is certainly a worthy goal. However, in addition to being in the business of saving dogs and cats from difficult circumstances and placing them in appropriate homes, Safe Haven plays an important part in the general health and welfare of people in our communities.

Benefits for Many in the Community

The simple act of providing a haven for homeless and unwanted pets has several benefits for the community at large and individuals in particular. Animals abandoned and left to roam often cause nuisance and health issues for humans in the area. Introducing these animals into a shelter helps reduce overpopulation, the spread of disease to owned animals and the destruction of private property. In addition, we receive many surrenders from elderly owners who no longer can care for an animal. These owners often have a very strong desire to ensure that their beloved pet goes to a suitable home. We have occasionally temporarily housed animals for domestic abuse victims while they are being relocated. In addition, we have often temporarily housed stray dogs while their owners are being located.

Benefit of Pets in the Home

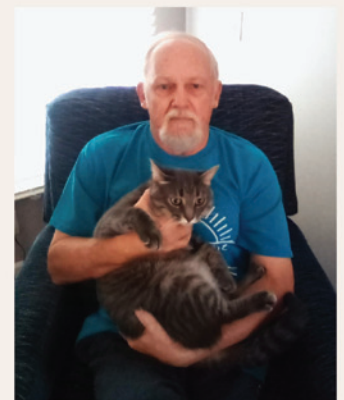
Pets in the home have been shown to be important in maintaining and improving mental health for owners. In many cases, the elderly (and others) have limited contact outside the home, and a pet serves to provide companionship and structure to daily lives. Walking a dog regularly provides for moderate exercise and the bonding of the dog and owner. Numerous studies have determined that pet ownership reduces stress and depression. Pet ownership has been shown to have positive effects on blood pressure and cholesterol levels.

Safe Haven, its staff, volunteers, and board are heavily invested in the welfare of pets and people in Jo Daviess County. We are thankful for the tremendous support we receive from individuals and organizations locally and beyond. With your continued support, we look to continuously improve our services to the areas we serve.

Safe Haven Continues Partnership with Elite Canine

When Nyla was selected to be the first dog in Elite's special program, Safe Haven's staff and volunteers were ecstatic for her. Everyone knew she was smart, but Elite brought her training to the next level. Her confidence blossomed as she successfully and eagerly worked her way through the program, and she learned all sorts of new things. With the help of our partnership with Elite, Nyla finally found her very own dog dad!

New Dog Intake, continued

Stainless steel kennels were installed in the renovated intake area, and the outside kennel walls were encased with stainless steel panels. The five new kennels included two that are oversized for use by very large dogs or a litter of puppies.

Team effort to reduce expenses

The initial bid for the project was \$78,000, with Safe Haven responsible for demolition of the old kennel area and items such as drywall finishing and painting. This bid did not include the polyurea floor coating. By working with local contractors (plumbing, electrical, and concrete work) who helped hold down expenses and tapping significant amounts of volunteer labor, the total renovation cost was reduced to about \$50,000, including the floor coating.

To help fund the renovation, Safe Haven established a program to accept contributions to name both the new kennels and the adjacent outside kennel runs in honor of an individual or animal. We have payments and commitments for naming rights totaling \$22,200. Rights of \$6,800 are unclaimed as of today. If interested in participating in this naming program, please contact the shelter.

Riley Subaru Teams Up with Safe Haven

iGive Offers Donation Program at Retail Web Sites
